1. Call to Order  
Mayor Johnson called the meeting to order.
2. Roll Call of Council Members  
Members present were Mayor Ron Johnson, Bilinda Prater, Eva Cortez, Tammy Mahan, Gary Stephenson, and Jared Shannon.
3. Welcome Guests  
Mayor Johnson welcomed the guest.
4. Invocation  
Councilwoman Prater gave the invocation.
5. Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag  
Councilwoman Prater led the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

8. Review/Approval Minutes of the Previous City Council Meeting

Councilman Shannon made a motion to give the Vandygriff's permission for water tap only on the main line south side of 2060 by Tony Williams house. Councilman Stephenson seconded the motion. The motion passed with a vote of 5/0.
- f. Consider and take action on funding for the new Geographic Information System (GIS) Integration with Cloudpermit Software – Tabled from February Meeting.  
Councilman Shannon made a motion to approve the funding request of \$3000.00 for the new GIS software to integrate with Cloudpermit. Councilwoman Prater seconded the motion. The motion passed with a vote of 5/0.
